**“Furnishing the Atomic Era”** - The phenomenal changes in the furnishings of our home environments can be seen through a wide range of artifacts, both on loan and from the Museum’s permanent collection. Included are furniture designs by Laverne, Eames, and Haywood-Wakefield on exhibit in the Slawson Gallery on the 4<sup>th</sup> Floor.

**“Peace Treaty of the Little Arkansas”** – The exhibit features a high quality reproduction of the Treaty from the National Archives, an artistic depiction of the Treaty signing commissioned by Fidelity Bank and a video of the treaty site today. The original treaty was last exhibited in Kansas during the state’s centennial, celebrated in 1961.

**“Western Lithograph Company - The Fine Art Printing Program”** Showing at the Wichita-Sedgwick County Historical Museum, Lois Kay Walls Gallery on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor.
