"Turn it up to 90! The Electric Guitar and the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its WICHITA WORLD DEBUT" A story told through dozens of rare and historic guitars – Running through October.

Over the past ninety years the Wichita-Sedgwick County area has produced a number remarkable electric guitarists as well as a few electric guitar luminaries. This is perhaps because the genesis of this instrument is uniquely tied to Wichita. In 1932, Gage Brewer of Wichita staged the world's first performances featuring the electrically amplified guitar. In this exhibition, we follow the fundamental development of the electric guitar starting from its invention in Los Angeles, and its public debut in Wichita. Today electric guitars are a ubiquitous mainstay of popular culture as the world's most popular musical instrument. Featuring dozens of historic electric guitars, exploring Wichita's connection to the most popular musical instrument of our time. The Museum has produced several exhibitions revealing Wichita's unique place in the instrument's history.
